As I prepared this New Year's message, I took a look back at the session minutes from 50 years ago. I looked at the last session meeting for 1964 and the first session meeting for 1965 and here are a few things that I found interesting.

Session, at its last meeting in 1964 voted to experiment with a coffee hour after worship during the following month. They also appointed an audit committee that included Harry Davidson and David Arnold.

At their first meeting in 1965, session voted to continue the coffee hour on a weekly basis. They also voted to apportion \$1,300 of the benevolence budget to mission programs at the GA, Synod, and presbytery levels. They also received a recommendation from the Stewardship and Mission Committee to have the next stewardship campaign done as it had been done in the past, with a kick-off dinner, keynote speaker, and an every home visitation. Perhaps their stewardship campaign hadn't been as fruitful as expected.

In contrast, at the last meeting of our session for 2014, we spent a lot of time talking about a budget that contained no benevolences and was still about \$15,000 in the red.

The problem with the budget is two-fold. First we will need more income if we are to balance the budget for the coming year. Second there is a great amount of uncertainty about where that income will come from. The majority of the income in the budget is projected to come from envelope offerings. The amount budgeted for that source is simply an estimate based on what was given last year.

Stewardship is a spiritual discipline. It involves giving back to God a small portion of all that God has given to us. We may not be able to all agree on how to spend the money given. In the end, though, I think that we can all agree on the objective for which the money is given. The objective is to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world and to be good news from Jesus Christ in the world. Session believes that the way the money is budgeted for next year goes a long way towards meeting that objective.

We haven't yet had our first meeting of session in the New Year. That is scheduled for Sunday, January 11th. Wouldn't it be nice if at that meeting we had enough pledged to reduce the uncertainty around envelope offering and that the amount pledged not only balances the budget but allows for benevolences as well. Fifty years from now someone might just look back at our minutes and be encouraged by what they see.

Take a look at the draft budget in this issue of the Beacon. Overall, is the amount budgeted for next year sufficient to meet the objective of the Gospel? What do you think it would take make it sufficient? I think it would take a pledge from you and from me. Kathy and I have submitted our pledge. I hope that you will do the same.

WHAT IS PER CAPITA?

The per capita apportionment is a per member assessment from New Castle Presbytery for each active member we have on our rolls. It represents St. Andrew's share of the administrative costs for the Presbytery (\$23.83), Synod of the Mid-Atlantic (\$.75) and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) (\$7.07). The per capita for 2013 is \$31.65 per member. This amount reflects a \$1.65 increase from last year.

The Session of St. Andrew's has reaffirmed their decision that only per capita money received from members will be used to pay our assessment in 2013. It will not be an annual budgeted amount.

By using the specially marked envelope found in your box of offering envelopes and paying your share of the per capita apportionment is prudent stewardship. We hope you will see it in that light and consider paying your per capita as soon as possible. Thank you!

Women Who bought a goat?

Naomi circle purchased a goat through Heifer International. They do not know where it will go but some family will receive it. A goat can produce 1000 pounds of milk in a year, nourishing its owners and providing income through the sale of milk. Naomi circle also sent contributions to a soup kitchen run by Little Children of the Philippines. The kitchen feeds 110 children per day, which is sometimes the only meal they get. They also are fed spiritually through Bible stories and songs. Back at home, our Presbyterian Women (PW) recently held the annual Cookie Walk and Soup Sale. Several men assisted in this project and we are very grateful for their help as well as all the women who donated their time and cookies. We unfortunately ran out of cookies, which was a first for us. Overall this was a great success.

If you are a woman reading this and/or attend St. Andrews you are a Presbyterian Woman. You do not have to belong to a Circle. The Newark Empowerment Center is located in space located at the Newark Methodist Church and supports the homeless population of Newark, DE. NEC is managed by Marc Marcus

NEC co-ordinates "Code Purple" for the Newark, Delaware area. "Code Purple" nights are called when the forecast is 20 degrees or below. When activated, "Code Purple" in Newark operates from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. in church space provided by eight different Newark faith communities on a rotating basis. Space in most places is limited to one or at most two rooms and can accommodate no more than 25 guests who are homeless.

Code Purple Needs Volunteers

Code Purple Decoded

Think of "cold people" when you read or hear the term "code purple." The Code Purple ministry offers cold people, the homeless in our area, supper and an overnight, 6 pm–6 am, in a safe, warm sanctuary when local weather forecasts predict 20°F or colder overnight.

Eight Newark churches participate on a rotating basis in the ministry sponsored by the Newark Empowerment Center (NEC).

- Newark United Methodist
- NewArk United Church of Christ
- Calvary Baptist
- Unitarian Universalist Fellowship
- Holy Family
- St. Thomas Episcopal
- First Presbyterian
- St. Paul's Lutheran

As soon as NEC declares a "Code Purple" night, the host church activates its volunteer staff. At First Presbyterian, volunteer teams serve for an average of 3 hours during "Code Purple" nights.

The Volunteer Teams:

- prepare supper and ready the dining area
- set up the sleeping area for the overnight guests
- greet guests and explain the rules; monitor behaviors
- admit late arrivals until 9 pm, when doors are locked
- stay from midnight to 6 am, in case a guest needs help; this team also prepares breakfast and sees guests out
- clean up


