As the New Year begins for St. Andrew's it is important to give some thought to the purpose of the Church. The purpose of the Church is to make disciples for Jesus Christ. John Calvin, the great theologian of the Reformation described the church as mother of the faithful. From his perspective the Church gives birth to faith and nurtures the faith of the faithful their whole life through. For Calvin the Church's very being is to bring people to faith and build up their faith. That is what Church is all about. It is all about faith. One might go so far as to say that Faith-R-Us.

It is often easy to forget that in the face of new challenges and new opportunities that new years bring. Yet if a church forgets its purpose is faith bad things can happen. When a church forgets that her role is to bring people to faith in Jesus Christ, she can stagnate and decline. When a church forgets that she is to nurture people in their faith, their faith can stagnate and die.

As we go forward this year I want to urge us to stay focused on faith: sharing it and growing it. I intend to challenge the session to consider the faith implications of all its decisions in the coming year. I intend to challenge the session to ask ourselves this question every time we make a decision: "Will this decision bring more people to faith and/or will it grow the faith of the people in the church? "If it will do neither then I will challenge the session to seriously consider making another decision that will give birth to or grow faith.

Friends this year like every year will bring challenges and opportunities for St. Andrew's. If we meet those challenges in faith with an eye to bringing more people to faith in Jesus Christ and growing our faith in Jesus Christ then we can expect good things to happen.

A long time ago when I was in industry, I worked for a company that had a word of the month. It was a word chosen to maintain our focus on what was most important to our business success. That was a long time ago and I can't remember any of the words. What I do remember is that words were very effective at keeping us on track. My recommendation to St. Andrew's is that we have a word of the year rather than a word of the month. I recommend that we all adopt the word FAITH. Let's stay focused on faith. Let's keep the faith, share the faith, and grow the faith in Jesus Christ. If we do I am sure St. Andrew's will overcome any challenges that come our way and make the best of all the opportunities as well.

DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In November, St. Andrew's received \$14,169.36. That amount is \$819.37 more than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted income for the month was \$13,349.99. We spent \$14,191.53 in November, which is \$43.70 more than was budgeted for the same period. This has resulted in a deficit for the month of \$22.17.

For 2015, through the end of November, St. Andrew's received \$135,158.54 compared to a budgeted income of \$146,848.89. This is a shortfall of \$11,691.35. On the expense side, through November, we have spent \$150,012.86. Budgeted expenses year to date are \$155,626.13, which means we have spent \$5,613.27 less than we thought we might. The bottom line is, so far this year, through November; we have spent \$150,012.86 and received \$135,158.54 for a deficit of \$14,854.32.
