**Treasurer's Report:** Income for October 2018 was \$9,895. Expenses for October were \$8,542.55. Surplus for October 2018 was \$1,351.45. Deficit for the YTD is -\$4,986.72

**Clerk's Report:** Carl Weeden (#350) passed away on October 26, 2018. A Memorial Luncheon was held on November 1, 2018 in Fellowship Hall.

- Membership total is 115 (66 women and 49 men)
- Guest preachers for the rest of 2018 are Candidate Deb Trevino (10/14, 11/11, 11/18, 11/25, 12/9, 12/16, 12/23, 12/24-7:00pm service and 12/30). Rev. Dr. Lyle Dykstra (10/21). Rev. Jim Herrington (10/28, 12/2 and 12/24- 11 pm service). Rev. Nona Holy (11/4).

- Received and approved all reports
- COMC has approved Rev. Jim Herrington to moderate the Congressional Meeting for electing officers for 2019 on November 11<sup>th</sup>, moderate the December Stated Session Meeting on Dec.9<sup>th</sup> and to install/ordain officers on January 6, 2019.
- E-mail vote to have communion at the Thanksgiving Service at 7 pm on Nov.20<sup>th</sup> with Rev. Asher Tunik serving the sacrament of Holy Communion by intinction.
- E-mail vote to hold A Congregational Meeting for the election of new officers after worship service on Nov. 11th
- Presbytery Commissioner Winnie Wagner will attend the meeting on Dec 1<sup>st</sup>.
- St, Andrew's will again participate in the Christmas Joy Offering. Envelopes will be placed in the church bulletin on Dec 2<sup>nd</sup>. Elder Florence Fonjweng will do a Minute for Mission about this in the near future.
- Budget for 2019 was approved as revised. There was a change by the Presbytery regarding the minimum compensation package for new ministers. Total operations income is \$136,810. Total pastor's compensation package is \$76,656. Total all staff expenses is \$124,459. Total programs is \$3,750. Total Building/Grounds is \$26,019. Total expenses is \$158,685. Net income/(loss) is -\$21,875.
- Meeting adjourned at 5:12pm and was closed in prayer by Ginny Jones.

# 842nd Stated Meeting of New Castle Presbytery December 1, 2018

The meeting was held at Presbyterian Church of the Covenant.

Prior to the start of the meeting, 3 workshops were held: 1. Ignite Grant Writing workshop (Dr. Sheldon Nix), 2. Centering ourselves on the Advent Journey (Rev. Emily Schwenker), and 3. Let's make a "Chrismon" (Charlotte Eggink). I attended the first workshop on Grant writing, "Show me The Money": Secrets of successful grant writing. Dr. Nix does this for a living and gave a lot of useful information. I will be glad to share this will anyone wishing to apply for a grant.

The meeting agenda was approved. Among motions approved in the Consent Agenda were the confirmation of the 844<sup>th</sup> Stated Meeting of NCP to be held Jan 12, 2019 at 10AM at Limestone PC. The September 2019 meeting will be held at Easton PC.

During the worship service with Rev. Jessie MacMillan (Connectional Presbyter/Stated Clerk) preaching, the new Moderator – Dianne Deming and Vice Moderator – Charles Collier were installed.

The COM&C (Committee on Ministers and Congregations): the Total Effective Minimum Salary for NCP, (due to SS COLA adjustment for 2019 of 2.8%) will be \$52,343.

Randy Clayton was welcomed as a Minister of Word and Sacrament from Baltimore.

Rev. Jim Horn was honorably retired. Memorial minutes were presented for Rev. Kevin Bowers, Rev. Jon Chapman and I was honored to present the tribute for Rev. Herbert Hoeflinger. A copy of my presentation is attached to this report.

The first reading of changes to the Book of Order was presented. A final vote will be held at the next Presbytery meeting. You can view these changes by going to the Presbytery website.

Martha Reisner from the Board of Pensions provided information regarding a new program for grants to pastors to help with paying off debts associated with education expenses. More information will be available in 2019.

Rev. Tom Davis, Interfaith Peacemaker, presented a proposal for a community-based peace studies project called Veterans' Peace Videos. Tom has been working with an Interfaith Veterans' Workgroup headquartered at PCOC. You can view this proposal as well as other programs/project Tom is involved in to help returning veterans overcome the various PTSD/stress issues they face. The Mid-Week Musings frequently carries his reports and ways you can become involved.

The New Castle Presbytery Budget for 2019 was Approved.

Total Income: \$1,239,794. This includes money from invested funds, Speer Trust, Per Capita, etc.

Expenses: Administration: \$425,866. This includes Employee and Office Overhead

Mission and Program: \$813,928. This includes Presbytery Ministry Expenses and Governing Bodies Per Capita, and Ignite which gets \$617,989 of that total. See me for a fuller break-down of the budget items.

Committee on Preparation for Missional Ministry: Presented Matt Waters as a candidate for examination. He passed with a unanimous vote!

The final draft for the Training of Commissioned Ruling Elders was passed. If interested in pursuing this course of training, please see me for the copy of the program.

A Partnership Agreement was approved and signed between CEDEPCA (Protestant Center for Pastoral Studies in Central American and NCP.

Ignite: Presentations were made by 3 groups who received >\$20,000 grants from Ignite. At the September Presbytery meeting, they were not prepared to make these presentations. "Riverfront Café" out of Grace Methodist Church; "Community Café" out of Community PC and "Guatemala – MAM coalition with several churches in NCP"

Trustee – Annual General Meeting Report given on 2018 activities and election of new Trustees.

Meeting adjourned with prayer.

#### Cookie Walk 2018

We are the mirror that reflects his light to the world. Our annual church cookie walk is an opportunity for our church members to reflect that light into our community. From the chatter and the smiles seen on the faces of people waiting in the long line to purchase cookies, it is apparent that this is an event our community loves. It takes the talents and efforts of many people to create a successful cookie walk. All the necessary elements came together during our 30th annual cookie walk on December 7. There were weeks of preparation leading up to the cookie walk. Members and friends were baking dozens and dozens of delicious cookies at home. Our youth and adults baked cookies at church as a Sunday night activity. Each day during the week of the cookie walk volunteers met to chop vegetables, make vegetable beef soup, pick chickens and make chicken corn soup, set up, and decorate. Behind the scenes, members were shopping and ordering all items needed. When the big day came, there were 6 tables filled with cookies in fellowship hall and one more table stacked with cookie tins to refill the trays on the tables. The smell of homemade soup wafted from the kitchen and a line began to form more than 30 minutes before our event was to begin. This year we were blessed with a large crowd to purchase cookies, soup and lunches. All our combined efforts helped us to raise \$4,7,93.36. This money will be used for missions, camperships and other church needs as determined by Presbyterian Women. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way with the cookie walk - whether you baked or volunteered during the week your help was greatly appreciated.

#### **DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE**

In November, St. Andrew's received \$9,873.00. That amount is \$2,120.23 less than the \$11,993.23 budgeted for the month. We spent \$9,932.35 in November. That is \$4,067.25 less than the budgeted expenses.

There was one large expenditure. We paid \$2,000 to replace the water heater and bring it up to code. All other expenses were the normal amounts.


The deficit for the month was \$59.35. Without the water heater replacement and repairs, we would have had a surplus of \$1,940.65. We wouldn't have had hot water, but we would have had a surplus. The deficit for the year is \$5,045.07.

Our reserves at the end of November were \$60,043.71. They were up \$679.40 for the month. Since January 1, our reserves are down \$4,608.60.

Effective January 1, 2019, the Board of Pensions has removed the requirement a church without a pastor must make a minimum contribution to the pension fund. This will save St. Andrew's \$594.91 per month until a new pastor is called.


God willing, we can expect monthly surpluses until a new pastor is called. When a new pastor is called and installed, we will have to re-evaluate our situation.
