Confirmation classes have begun at St. Andrew's. They have been underway for the last few weeks. We have eight young people participating in the process this year. I want to share with you some thoughts on the process.

First, let me explain what confirmation is. Confirmation in the Reformed tradition is the time when a young person's faith is "confirmed" by a public confession of faith and reception into active membership in the church. Most often but not always those participating in confirmation classes have been baptized as infants on the basis of the faith of their parents.

Confirmation requires a faith decision on the part of those to be confirmed. The classes leading up to that decision are a time to explore the Christian faith, try it on for size, and see how it fits. The process takes many forms in different churches. Some churches do it as a yearlong process; others do it as a more intensive study. Some use one curriculum. Some use another.

This year I chose to simply get back to basics. I chose to use the Bible, the Study Catechism, and the spiritual practices of the Church. I also chose to do it as a short process lasting eight weeks with reception on Easter Sunday.

Each day the participants read assigned passages from Scripture, questions from the study catechism, and pray the Lord's Prayer. Each Thursday evening we gather to eat Pizza, discuss the readings, share our thoughts, worship together with the choir and the praise band, and listen to someone from the congregation share their faith.

Elder Al Crowe agreed to assist me in the leading of the class but couldn't join us until week four. He had a little thing called hernia surgery to recover from first. Deacon Rob Johnson graciously agreed to substitute for Al during his recovery. Rob did a great job as usual.

This year's format seems to be working for me anyway. It has certainly strengthened my faith. The final test is whether or not the participants find it helpful to their faith. Please keep the class in your prayers.




