A Healthy Heart

The Command to Love

February is the month we celebrate, among other things (like my birthday!), Valentine's Day. Valentine's Day is named for a certain Valentinus, who died around 270 CE, evidently as a martyr. The circumstances of his life and death are obscure, however, and he may be further confused with others of that name who lived in the fifteenth century. According to History.com, there are over a dozen St. Valentines, in addition to a pope by that name who served a mere forty days in 827. That site goes on to add that the notion of romantic love was not associated with these Valentines till the time of Chaucer in the fourteenth century (http://www.history.com/news/6-surprising-facts-about-st-valentine):

The medieval English poet Geoffrey Chaucer often took liberties with history, placing his poetic characters into fictitious historical contexts that he represented as real. No record exists of romantic celebrations on Valentine's Day prior to a poem Chaucer wrote around 1375. In his work "Parliament of Foules," he links a tradition of courtly love with the celebration of St. Valentine's feast day–an association that didn't exist until after his poem received widespread attention. The poem refers to February 14 as the day birds (and humans) come together to find a mate. When Chaucer wrote, "For this was sent on Seynt Valentyne's day / Whan every foul cometh ther to choose his mate," he may have invented the holiday we know today.

Interestingly, Chaucer's reference to birds mating and a Catholic association of Valentine with being the patron saint of beekeeping may give us the basis for the axiom of "the birds and the bees." While Valentine's Day may be easily dismissed as another of those "Hallmark holidays," the one who so dismisses it and neglects to remember his or her significant other is likely to hear bad tidings!

In the gospels, Jesus is questioned many times by the Pharisees and Sadducees. At one point "one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?' He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all you mind." This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets'" (Matt. 22:35-40). Some may find it peculiar, even impossible, that God should command us to love, but love in Scripture is not simply some warm feeling, or a mere emotion, though it will often involve that. Love in Scripture is faithful obedience from the heart. It is doing what God wants, regardless of how we may "feel" about it. It is a sacrificial yielding of our own desires to the desire, the will, of God. Obviously, this flies in the face of our innate tendency to seek first our own wishes and desires. It is really only possible so to love as we are renewed in the inner person after



the image of God through repentance from sin and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ by the working of the Holy Spirit. "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Rom. 5:5). "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God" (1 John 4:7).


DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In December, St. Andrew's received \$15,657.62. That amount is \$1,644.14

more than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted monthly income in 2016 was \$14,013.48. We spent \$13,453.59 in December, which is \$543.31 less than the budgeted expenses of \$13,996.90. The surplus for the month was \$2,204.03.

In 2016 St. Andrew's received \$157,364.56 and spent \$160,339.08 resulting in a deficit of \$2,974.52.
