I felt like it sort of snuck up on me. That fits right in with Easter. Easter came surprisingly and unexpectedly for the disciples. It sort of snuck up on them too.

They were despondent, discouraged and afraid after the Crucifixion. Their whole world had come crashing down around them. Then when they were at their lowest, something surprising and unexpected happened. The Resurrection happened! Jesus rose from the grave and joy replaced despondency, courage replaced fear, and hope replaced despair. His Resurrection, His triumph over the grave meant that He was who they thought He was and that they would be able to follow him not just to the grave but also through it.

Friends, Easter is the most important holiday on the Christian calendar because it opens the door to an astounding future. It opens the door onto a future of a totally different world, a world restored to what it was created to be, a world in which bodies don't age, arteries don't clog, and life is lived fully and abundantly forevermore.

It is easy to miss the importance of Easter. In popular culture, it has become the poor cousin of Christmas. Christmas seems to get all the hoopla. It deserves a lot of that hoopla. It just doesn't deserve all of it. Easter deserves as much, if not more because Easter confirms everything that we believe about Jesus and gives a foretaste of everything that we hope for in Jesus.

This Easter, I want to encourage you to celebrate the Easter Holiday with the same intensity and the same joy with which you celebrated Christmas. Use your celebration to witness to the world that there is a way out of despondency, despair, and discouragement. His name is Jesus Christ and invite people to put their faith and trust for their future in Him. They will not be disappointed and neither will you.



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Here are a few highlights of what our special offering did last year. Through *Presbyterian Disaster Assistance*, 15 countries received aid and support after catastrophic natural events and for refugees from ISIL and displaced people in Syria. 25 states received help after severe winter storms, wildfires, and flooding. Through the *Presbyterian Hunger Program*, over 308,000 people, who were living in extreme poverty, now have increased food security and livelihoods. \$1.6 million was leveraged for local, national, and international hunger work. The *Self-Development of People* partners with self-help projects in the U.S. and abroad that focus on literacy, human rights, rehabilitation and skill development.

Our 2015 Annual Report says we contributed \$350. Let's try to beat that amount this year. Typically we receive the offering on Easter but this year we'll have envelopes in the pews each Sunday until then for your convenience. Please give generously. Thank you.



DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In January, St. Andrew's received \$13,792.95. That amount is \$220.38 less than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted monthly income in 2016 is \$14,013.33. We spent \$13,961.39 in January, which is \$34.78 less than was budgeted for the same period. This has resulted in a deficit for the month of \$168.44. Since January is the first month of the year, the year to date figures are the same as the monthly figures.

For 2015, St. Andrew's received \$151,988.74 compared to a budgeted income of \$160,200.00. This is a shortfall of \$8,211.26. On the expense side, in 2015, we spent \$162,883.03. Budgeted expenses were \$169,775.00, which means we spent \$6,891.97 less than we thought we might. The bottom line is, in 2015, we spent \$162,883.03 and received \$151,988.74 for a deficit of \$10,894.29.
