Deacon March Beacon Article:

- Easter is April 21st this year. The Deacons will be supplying food baskets for the holiday to needy families with children that attend Brookside Elementary School. We are in need of hams or turkeys. We supplement those with some fresh food plus staples from our church Food Pantry. All kinds of staples such as peanut butter & jelly, soups, fruit (applesauce, etc.), cake or brownie mixes, jello, gravy, meats (canned tuna, etc.), spaghetti sauce, peas & carrots (canned), boxed and/or canned potatoes. Please make sure that items are not due to expire shortly.
- In March, the Deacons will be collecting money to support the "Laundry for the Lord". The funds for this are coordinated by Kingswood United Methodist Church to purchase vouchers from Brookside Laundromat that the Newark Empowerment Center distributes to homeless that are in transitional housing, students, and those that are applying for jobs. The cost in \$6.75 per voucher for one large washer and one dryer. Each Sunday in March, a deacon will be up in Fellowship Hall after the service to take donations. Large or small amounts, even the change in your pocket, will let us help our neighbors.

DOLLAR\$ AND \$EN\$E - THE BOTTOM LINE

In January, St. Andrew's received \$9,488.05. That amount is \$2,079.20 less than the \$11,567.25 budgeted for the month. We spent \$7,210.33 in January. That is \$6,013.42 less than the budgeted expenses.


All expenses were the normal amounts, except I forgot to pay the fourth quarter per capita payment of \$804.75. I paid it in the first week of January.

The surplus for the month was \$2,277.72. Had I paid the per capita payment in December, the surplus would have been \$3,082.47.

Our reserves at the end of December were \$61,164.58. On January 31, our reserves were \$68,554.84. Our reserves increased \$7,390.26 in January. That is also the increase year to date.

God willing, we can expect monthly surpluses until a new pastor is called. When a new pastor is called and installed, we will have to re-evaluate our situation.
