## PRAYER EMPHASIS FOR APRIL

#### Run the Race at Any Age

"Therefore since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 12:1-2



As I write this message the news is dominated by the Islamic terrorist attacks in Brussels that left 31 dead and hundreds injured. The Islamic State that stands behind these attacks regularly kills innocent people in areas beyond their control and routinely engages in genocide in areas that they do control. The sadness is that they do it in the name of God.

Some well meaning Christians think that the most helpful thing to do in response to such attacks is to paper over the differences between Islam and Christianity in order to reduce tensions. They argue that we all worship the same God and that we should tone down our witness in order not to offend Muslims. The horrendous violence perpetrated in the name of God calls out for a much different response.

God is love, not hate. That is abundantly clear in the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus the Christ. We clearly see in Him the "image of the invisible God" and we clearly see in Him the image in which God created all people. If people want to know what the true God looks like and what they are meant to look like, all they have to do is look at Jesus. Jesus said "know the truth and the truth will set you free." The truth is Jesus the Christ. He presents a stark contrast to the god of hate that the Islamic terrorists mistakenly serve. The most helpful thing that we can do as Christians is faithfully witness to Him and not paper over the differences between Him and Muhammad or the founder of any other religion. The differences are real. The differences are profound. The differences are important. The differences are transformative. The most helpful thing that we can do in the face of this horrendous violence is to share the truth about Jesus who is "the way, and the truth, and the life" and boldly live that truth in love.

We should do it the way the Apostle Peter recommends we do it:

Do not repay evil for evil...Do not fear what they fear; do not be frightened. But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander. For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous to bring you to God (1 Peter 3:9; 14-18 NIV).

Remember Christianity is not a religion of coercion or conquest. We should and can defend religious freedom without affirming or agreeing with everything the followers of other religions believe or do. Let us not forget that God has given the Church the Cross and the government the sword and never confuse the two. The government wields the sword to protect the rights of everyone. The Church carries the Cross to announce salvation for everyone who will accept it. "God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him" (John 3:17 NIV).

Hatred breeds more hatred and violence breeds more violence. The witness of love and the sanctity of all life is the best way to shine light into the darkness of death. Pray for the victims. Yes, even pray for the terrorists who are our enemies. Pray for the followers of Islam, the followers of other religions, and the followers of no religion at all. Pray that ALL should come to know the Truth and that the Truth will set them free.
