The Passion of Christ

I enjoy seeing how words change over time. Sometimes a word in contemporary usage bears no apparent relation to the original meaning. One of the most celebrated examples is the word "nice." The source of this word was the Latin *nescius*, which means "ignorant", formed from the negative particle *ne-* and the base of the verb *scire*, "know" (from which we derive "science"). "This passed into English via Old French *nice* with minimal change of meaning, but from then on a slow but sure semantic transformation took place, from 'foolish' via 'shy,' 'fastidious,' and 'refined' to on the one hand 'minutely accurate or discriminating' (as in a 'nice distinction') and on the other 'pleasant, agreeable' (first recorded in the second half of the 18th century)" (John Ayto, *Dictionary of Word Origins*, 1990, 364). I trust we all seek to be *nice* in the modern sense of the term!

Another word that has changed remarkably from its original meaning is the word "passion." It comes from the Latin *pati*, meaning *to suffer*, which is also the basis of our word "patient." A stem of the word, *pass*, became the noun *passio*, which denoted specifically *the suffering of Christ on the cross*. This was, of course, the use of the word in the 2004 Mel Gibson film, "The Passion of the Christ." The "familiar modern senses, in which 'strength of feeling' has been transferred from 'pain' to 'sexual attraction' and 'anger', did not emerge until the 16th century" (Ayto, 385). It is a marvel of the human use of terms that a word originally having to do with *suffering* should come to be associated with *sexuality* and *anger*, as if even the latter two uses of the word had any inherent relation?!

We may not be able to explain how "passion" came to be associated with *love* from an original sense of *suffering*, but certainly we can see that link between love and suffering in the plan of God for our salvation! "In this is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins" (1 John 4:10). "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). "But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). There are many, many more passages from the Bible we could adduce to demonstrate the link God has made between his

suffering and love for us in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Indeed, it is the theme of the entire Bible. God loves us so much that he was willing to undergo the sacrifice of his only Son for us and our salvation. Love involves sacrifice, suffering, for the well-being of others.

We are called to love one another in this same way, to suffer for one another and to sacrifice ourselves for others. We are to be "compassionate" (from the Latin *cum*, "with," and *passio*, "suffer"), to be "sympathetic" (the Greek form of the same words). "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God" (1 John 4:7). True love suffers and sacrifices for another. God has shown us that love. May his Spirit shed that love abroad in our hearts!




DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In February, St. Andrew's received \$10,821.15. That amount is \$2,286.85 less than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted monthly income in 2017 is \$13,108. We spent \$13,276.99 in February, which is \$920.36 less than the budgeted expenses of \$14,197.35. The deficit for the month was \$2,455.84. The deficit for the year is \$2,823.54

In 2016 St. Andrew's received \$157,364.56 and spent \$160,339.08 resulting in a deficit of \$2,974.52.
