Docket was approved and quorum was present.

February Stated Session Minutes we're approved.

Treasurer's Report was presented and approved pending audit. The income for February was \$8,980.60. The expenses for February were \$6,913.56. The surplus for the month of February was \$2,067.04.

Motions made, seconded and approved:

- Accept all reports (Treasurer, Deacons and Presbytery)
- Standing Rules were approved as written. The Rules will be reviewed and re-evaluated in September.
- Approved a project to be done by **Grant Hardy, Jr.** for his rank of "Eagle Scout". It will consist of redoing the driveway on the side of the church, planting shrubs around the HVAC unit and evening crown around the driveway for proper drainage. All fundraising will be done by Grant, Jr. But donations will be welcomed.
- To proceed with the proposal for a "Congregation Garden" on our church property.

Motion was made to adjourn this meeting at 4:56 pm and was closed with prayer by Darrell DiStefano.

The next regularly scheduled Session Meeting will be held on Sunday, April 14, 2019 at 4:00 pm.

Deacon's May Beacon:

Thank you to everyone that contributed to our many efforts the last several months! We are a small church but with the Lord's touch we are able to help many.

- We collected \$268.50 for Laundry for the Lord. We do this with Kingswood United Methodist Church
 and several other churches. Vouchers are given to homeless that are in transitional housing, students
 and job seekers so they can wash their clothes at the Brookside Laundromat. Together we helped
 purchased almost 43 vouchers.
- With your contributions to the Food Closet and your hams and turkeys, we assembled eleven Easter Holiday Food Baskets for local families. All the families have children and many send their thanks back to you for your generosity.
- Five bags of personal care items were delivered to The Sunday Breakfast Mission. The Mission
 provides temporary housing for men, women and families, Bible based counseling, breakfasts and
 dinners, and a once a week medical clinic. The items we have sent help those in need remember they
 are valued and welcomed.

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The Baby Bottle Benefit for A Door of Hope Pregnancy Center will be held this year from Sunday, April 28 to Sunday, May 26. This is a major source of funding for A Door of Hope, which provides pregnancy testing (including ultrasounds), counseling, and support to women who are unsure of what to do in an unexpected pregnancy. Hope classes provide expectant moms with all they need to know during each step of the pregnancy process as well as what to do in the first three years following the birth of their babies. Abstinence education is provided in local schools and abortion recovery assistance to those who need emotional support following an abortion. Most importantly, all of these services are provided *free of charge* by well-trained support staff who have as their guiding principles the love of Jesus Christ and the desire to share the gospel with those who are struggling during these pivotal periods in life. The Baby Bottle Boomerang is simply a way for you to put loose change or dollar bills or checks (made out to A Door of Hope) in for the help of this ministry. It is akin to a freewill offering and has been authorized by the session of St. Andrew's church. We hope you will give generously.

A Door of Hope has three locations, for in addition to those indicated on the masthead above, there is also a new center in Middletown at 316 E. Main St. If you know anyone who is pregnant and unsure of how to proceed with what is involved, encourage them to contact A Door of Hope. On behalf of the staff of A Door of Hope, heartfelt thanks to all in the congregation for their support of this important ministry in a state that, unfortunately, has the highest per capita abortion rate in the country.

DOLLAR\$ AND \$EN\$E - THE BOTTOM LINE

In March, St. Andrew's received \$11,124.20. That amount is \$425.65 less than the \$11,567.25 budgeted for the month. We spent \$9,068.74 in March. That is \$4,140.10 less than the budgeted expenses of \$13,208.84.

There were several large expenditures: annual pest control contract - \$529.92; quarterly insurance payment - \$671.25; music license annual cost - 411.00; website hosting \$499.00 and first quarter per capita - \$819.50 for a total of \$2,930.67. All other expenses were normal.

The surplus for the month was \$2,055.46. The surplus for 2019 year to date is \$6,399.22.

Our reserves at the end of March were \$75,834.21, an increase of \$2,881.58 for the month. Our reserves increased \$14,669.63 since January 1, 2019.

God willing, we can expect monthly surpluses until a new pastor is called. When a new pastor is called and installed, we will have to re-evaluate our situation.


