

March Stated Session Minutes were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's Report was presented and approved pending audit. March income (5 Sundays) was \$11,124.20. Expenses for March were \$9,068.74. Surplus for March was \$2,055.46. Surplus for the YTD is \$6,399.22.

DOLLAR\$ AND \$EN\$E - THE BOTTOM LINE

In April, St. Andrew's received \$9,666.40. That amount is \$1,900.85 less than the \$11,567.25 budgeted for the month. We spent \$7,097.82 in April. That is \$6,027.68 less than the budgeted expenses of \$13,208.83.

There was one large expenditure. The annual premium for the Workers' Comp insurance was paid. It was \$853. All other expenses were normal.


The surplus for the month was \$2,568.58. The surplus for 2019 year to date is \$8,967.80.

Our reserves at the end of April were \$80,956.86, an increase of \$5,122.65 for the month. Our reserves have increased \$19,792.28 since January 1, 2019.

God willing, we can expect monthly surpluses until a new pastor is called. When a new pastor is called and installed, we will have to re-evaluate our situation.


