Summer is a wonderful time of year. It gives us the opportunity to get out and see the beauty of creation in all its splendor. I want to encourage you to enjoy God's creation this summer and listen to what it has to say to you about God.

Yes, that is right. Listen to what creation has to say about God this summer for it has a message for all of us to hear. The message is captured for us in the Book of Psalms, in particular the 19th Psalm. That Psalm begins with this verse:

"The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork."

It then goes on to say:

"There is no speech, nor are there words; their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out to all the earth and their words to the end of the world."

What a marvelous thought. Creation speaks to us daily of the One who created it and gave it its beauty. It tells us of God by displaying His handiwork. It tells us that there is a God, that He is amazingly creative, and that He cares daily for his creation.

Creation's voice has its limits though. It cannot tell us all that we might want to know about God or need to know about what God wants of us. Only God can tell us those things. And the good news is that God has told us those things through his written Word, the Bible, and his living Word, Jesus the Christ.

I find it interesting that Psalm 19 opens talking about creation and then transitions to speaking about God's Word. Starting in verse 7, it begins to speak about the Law of the Lord. It goes on to describe the Law of the Lord as perfect, sure, right, clear, pure, and true. It then ends with a prayer that I often use at the beginning of my sermon. It reads:

"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer."

The bottom line of this, is that I would like to encourage you to not only listen to creation proclaim the glory of God this summer. I would also like to encourage you to listen to God's Word proclaim God's Glory this summer as well. I encourage you, if you don't already do so, to set aside time each day to read God's Word this summer, look at God's world through the lens of God's Word, and meditate on what you see and hear. Pick a Book of the Bible and read through it in its entirety this summer. Add it to your summer reading list. Listen to what God has to say and be still and know that He is God. Have a blessed summer!

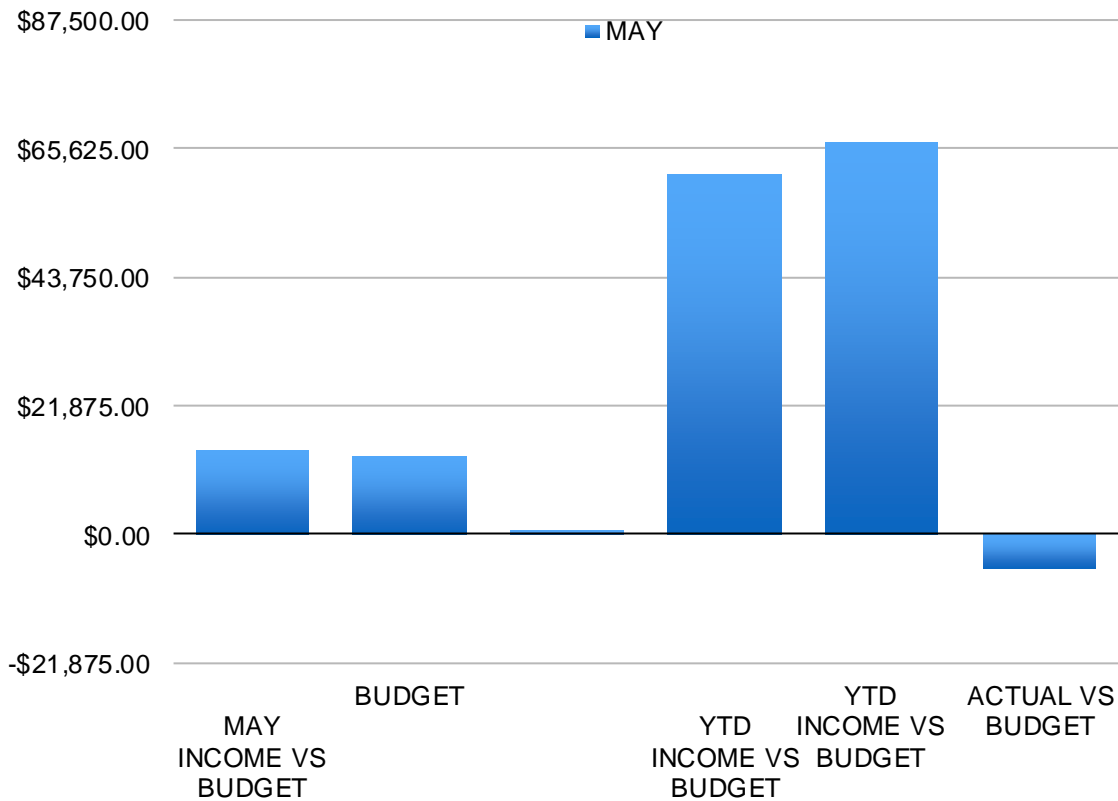
DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In May, St. Andrew's received \$14,205.47. That amount is \$855.48 more than the income budgeted for the month. We spent \$13,778.14 in May, which is \$369.69 less than was budgeted for the same period, resulting in a surplus for the month of \$427.33.

For 2015, through the end of May, St. Andrew's received \$61,131.83 compared to a budgeted income of \$66,749.95. This is a shortfall of \$5,618.12. On the expense side, through May, we have spent \$71,626.87. Budgeted expenses year to date are \$70,739.15 which means we spent \$887.72 more than we thought we might. The bottom line is, so far this year, we have spent \$71,626.87 and received \$61,131.83 for a deficit of \$10,495.04.
