

Thinking about our Faith

On Sunday, June 11, in lieu of the sermon, I took questions from the congregation and answered as many as I could in the available time. Many questions remain from those submitted, and a few more will be answered here and in subsequent newsletters. If you ever have a question and don't know where to turn, let me know and I'll offer what I can or try to steer you to a place where you can look further yourself.



A few questions had to do with time, in some way or another. "Since there is evidence that the earth existed millions of years ago, how do we know that God made it?" Actually, the evidence is that the earth existed *billions* of years ago, 4.5 billion. The universe is gauged to be about 13.8 billion years old. "How do we know that God made it?" Simply put, there really isn't any other good explanation! How else could something have come from nothing? Contemporary cosmology tends to speak of the Big Bang as a "singularity," which simply means a unique occurrence. It does not say how this occurred, only that it did, after which cosmologists can mathematically pinpoint what ensued in tiny fractions of seconds. The notion of singularity seems to me to be a naturalistic way of invoking the essence of miracle apart from allusion to God. There is no other reasonable way of explaining how things came to be than that God called them into being. Ultimately, of course, we know God created by faith (Heb. 11:3), as his Word opens with these words ("In the beginning God created," Gen. 1:1) and our own awe and wonder at the grandeur and complexity of it all so confirm.

After God created humanity, unique from all that preceded because made in the image of God, there is in Gen. 3 the big test. Would Adam and Eve obey God and be confirmed in righteousness or would they fail? A question was asked, "Was God's intention to test humans when the tree was placed with the forbidden fruit? Why would he purposefully set the human race to fail?" The second question seems to affirm the idea of a test, which was indeed the intention of God in setting the bounds of obedience. Humanity was created by God to love him and we demonstrate love for God by obedience to him. This is how love is exhibited in the Bible, obedience from the heart. Mere outward obedience is insufficient, as that was the arrogant legalism decried in the Pharisees and Sadducees. To love God means the commandments "are to be upon your hearts" (Deut. 6:6). Jesus said, "If you love me, you will obey what I command" (John 14:15). Adam and Eve did not obey God, so there was a corruption of their goodness as a result of their exaltation of themselves, for in deciding whether to obey their Creator or Satan, they placed themselves above both as if they themselves were divine. This was nothing less than an inversion of the Creator-creature relationship, supposing themselves to be as gods instead of the creatures they knew themselves to be. This continues to be the fundamental problem for humanity, the sinful nature we all must deal with and be redeemed from through faith in Christ.

Was God surprised at the fall of humanity in Adam? I don't think so. I don't think anything surprises God. God knows all, not simply as possibilities, but as what will actually occur because he himself has planned it all out from the beginning, indeed from before the beginning. That is the consistent teaching of the Reformed faith as expressed in our confessions. The Westminster Confession says, e.g., "God from all eternity did by the most wise and holy counsel of his own will, freely and unchangeably ordain whatsoever comes to pass; yet so as thereby neither is God the author of sin; nor is violence offered to the will of the creatures, nor is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather established." If God "chose us in him [Christ] before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight" (Eph. 1:4), then God obviously foreknew both the fall of humanity and the salvation of his elect in Christ, particularly since it was according to "God's set purpose [predestination] and foreknowledge" that Christ was put to death by the hands of wicked men in being nailed to a cross.

This gets us to a debated area of Reformed theology known as lapsarianism, the relation of God's decree of election to the lapse or fall of humanity, for which there are two basic views. One, supralapsarianism, says God foreordained the fall of humanity, along with all else that occurs in the unfolding of the universe, before he created anything and that he chose whom he would save prior to creating anything. Certainly that is what Eph. 1:4 seems to say. The other, sublapsarianism, says God chose a people unto himself after the fall, which he allowed but did not necessarily foreordain. Both views were held by representatives at the Westminster Assembly and have been held throughout the history of Reformed theology. We needn't get into the fine points of the debate itself here. Suffice it to say that God "does as he pleases with the powers of heaven and the peoples of the earth. No one can hold back his hand or say to him, 'What have you done?'" (Dan. 4:35). Indeed, God "works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory" (Eph. 1:11-12). All God does is ultimately for his glory to be magnified. He ordains and allows all that occurs so that we who repent and believe the gospel will acknowledge and praise him here for his grace and majesty and he ordains and allows others to be condemned in order that his purpose and power might be exalted (see, e.g., Rom. 9:10-29). God ordained and allowed humanity to fall in order to exalt his amazing grace to his elect in delivering from sin, death and condemnation through the person and work of his Son, Jesus Christ, that they might be to the glory of his grace. God does not exist to exalt us; we (and all things) exist to exalt him!

For the YTD total revenue was \$50,999.71. For the YTD expenses were \$54,053.63. For the YTD net revenue over expenses was -\$3,053.92.




DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In May, St. Andrew's received \$10,139.30. That amount is \$2,968.70 less than the \$13,108 budgeted for the month. We spent \$13,491.01 in May, which is \$706.34 less than the budgeted expenses of \$14,197.35. The deficit for the month was \$3,351.71. The deficit for the year is \$6,405.63.

In 2016 St. Andrew's received \$157,364.56 and spent \$160,339.08 resulting in a deficit of \$2,974.52.
