September begins a new program year for the church. As I think back over the last 14 years as your pastor, I think about the new ministries that each program year has brought. Over the years those ministries touched many lives and changed lives as well. They did so because the ministries were for the most part inspired and empowered by the Holy Spirit to bring the Gospel into people's lives.

As I preached through the Book of Acts over the last several weeks, I became deeply impressed by how focused was the early Church. They understood their mission and in spite of all the obstacles that they faced, they stayed focused on the key components of that mission. They stayed focused on "the proclamation of the Gospel for the salvation of humankind" and "the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God," which are the first two Great Ends of the Church in our *Book of Order* (F-1.0401). Those great ends are part of St. Andrew's denominational heritage. They come from The United Presbyterian Church of North America (UPCNA) that planted St. Andrew's in 1954.

As I thought about the early Church and the Great Ends of the Church, I also thought about my 26+ years as a business leader. During those years I learned that for a business to be successful it had to stay focused on the two or three key components of its business. That often meant not doing a lot of things that were interesting to do but would spread its resources too thin and distract it from what made it successful.

Well, as we enter the new church year, I think it might be wise for us to emphasize the two key components of this and every church's mission: the proclamation of the Gospel and the care of the people of God. In a time of limited financial resources and unlimited power of the Spirit perhaps we should concentrate on what the Spirit would have us do: proclaim the Gospel and take care of the children of God. I wonder what that might look like. I also wonder what that might do to us and do to the community around us. Take some time to think about it and let me know what you think.

F. Things to Think About:

Supreme Court Decision on Marriage

I am concerned that the majority decision of the court spoke of the right for people to speak about their opposition to same sex marriage but did not explicitly state that people who perform religious weddings have a right to refuse to perform a same sex marriage. We live in a very litigious society and I wonder if someone somewhere will sue a church or a pastor for not performing a same sex marriage. Although I am not a lawyer, I suppose an argument could be made that someone who performs weddings that are recognized as civil weddings, weddings performed according to the laws of a certain state, has an obligation not to discriminate against same sex couples. Whatever the legal merits of any case, the cost to defend oneself in a court of law is very expensive. It is highly doubtful that any help would be available from the PCUSA or one's presbytery. I am in the process of thinking through various options.

Mission Grant Check Hold

As you know, the grant check from the presbytery for the Cameroon Pastors' Retreat was placed on hold by an action of the Council. That hold was released when it was shown that the action taken by council was contrary

to a ruling of the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission. We will have to wait to see if the Council rescinds the action at the next Council meeting.

Vacation/ Study Leave

I plan to be on vacation or study leave from August 24th through August 31st. If I am up to date on writing my doctoral project it will be vacation. If not, it will be study leave.

DOLLARS AND SENSE - THE BOTTOM LINE

In July, St. Andrew's received \$9,910.04. That amount is \$3,439.95 less than the income budgeted for the month. Budgeted income for the month was \$13,349.99. We spent \$13,553.89 in July, which is \$593.94 less than was budgeted for the same period, resulting in a deficit for the month of \$3,643.85.

For 2015, through the end of July, St. Andrew's received \$81,924.12 compared to a budgeted income of \$93,449.83. This is a shortfall of \$11,525.81. On the expense side, through July, we have spent \$98,007.30. Budgeted expenses year to date are \$99,034.81 which means we spent \$1,027.51 less than we thought we might. The bottom line is, so far this year; we have spent \$98,007.30 and received \$81,924.12 for a deficit of \$16,083.18.
